## HIGHLIGHTS



Meet the capital of the Dodecanese (South Aegean) an island which is ideal not only for those who want to relax but also for those looking for an action-packed holiday! With its bright green hills, rich green valleys and uninterrupted line of golden beaches, Rhodes is truly a blessed place. Add in the excellent facilities for tourism, the island's special blend of cosmopolitan and traditional, and numerous cultural and archaeological sites and you've got the perfect destination. It amazes visitors with the Medieval architecture and the many interesting monuments; the Old Town of Rhodes is a true gem to walk around, a fantastic

place from the past. The Street of the Knights, the Palace and Hippocrates Square are the main spots of Rhodes Old Town.

## DETAILED ITINERARY

### Day 1 – 09:35 am Arrival at Rhodes Airport

-Direct transfer to the hotel Rodos Palace (or the Mediterranean Hotel – according to availability).

-Walk to Old Town, one of the largest medieval towns in Europe. We enter through the Gate of Freedom. The fascinating medieval fortress-like buildings, the bastions, walls, gates, narrow alleys, minarets, old houses, fountains, tranquil and busy squares make it feel like you have stepped back into medieval times. The cobblestoned Street of the Knights, one of the best preserved medieval streets in Europe, is packed with medieval inns that used to play host to the soldiers of the Order of the Knights. At the end of the Street, in the Museum Square, stands the Hospital of the Knights, which houses the Archaeological Museum. Across the square is the Church of Our Lady of the Castle, the Orthodox Cathedral of Rhodes in Byzantine times that became the Catholic Cathedral when the Knights occupied the city. Now it hosts the Byzantine Museum.

- Lunch in a local restaurant in the Old Town; return to the hotel.
- Free time for a relaxing walk and shopping.
- Dinner to the fine restaurant “Kioupia”.



## Day 2

- We will drive to Lindos. Nestling at the foot of a steep rock and beautifully surrounded by the sea lies the traditional settlement of Lindos; on the top of the same rock stands a centuries-old acropolis, proudly overlooking the archipelagos. The landscape of Lindos encapsulates the essence of the island of Rhodes: a surprisingly felicitous blend of ancient and medieval! With 600,000 visitors annually, Lindos competes with Delphi as the second most visited archaeological site in Greece. The view of Lindos village with its cubic houses sprawling down the hillside under the acropolis is one of the most photographed scenes in Greece. The whitewashed labyrinth of little alleyways was deliberately designed to confuse pirates; today this layout makes wandering around the town a real adventure! The winding streets of the traditional well-preserved settlement of Lindos form a great backdrop to a rejuvenating evening stroll. There are picture-perfect medieval captains' residences built around votsalotó (meaning pebbly) courtyards with emblems on their heavy wooden doorways. Arched entrances adorn the streets adding a cosmopolitan flair to the settlement.



## Day 3

- One day cruise to the little island of Symi. While approaching the port of Symi, one has the overwhelming feeling of entering a perfectly painted image of a scenic traditional village. The entrance of the horseshoe-shaped port is dominated by Rolói, a clock tower. Right in front of it there is the statue of the fisher boy, Michalaki (= little Michael) which seems to be welcoming the visitors to the island. The Town Hall, the cathedral, the square and the Naval Museum of Symi are the main attractions on this side. The latter lends an insight to the naval tradition of the island and boasts, amongst else, exhibits representing the evolution of sponge fishing through the years. A stony stairway of 500 steps leads to the upper part of the town. The locals call it Kalí Stráta, which means "good way". Some awesome churches fill the streets of Chorió with beauty. Icon screens, post-byzantine icons and gravel yards are worth seeing here. Overlooking Chorió there is Kástro (castle). Actually, it is the remnants of a castle built by the knights of St John in the 14th century as an expansion to an old byzantine castle on the same site.

- Lunch at a restaurant of Symi.
- Return to the island of Rhodes and the hotel.
- Gala dinner at the hotel (offered by the hotel).



## Day 4

-After breakfast drive to the airport for the return journey to Athens (departure: 10:10 am)


### Hotel Rodos Palace
